You are receiving this information because you may be transferred from NCCU to 5A, 5B or 6A since your condition is stable and you will not need a nurse at the bedside at all times. The reason you are being moved is so that you can continue to heal and recover in a safe and friendly environment.

Your Healthcare Team

Besides your nurse, patient care assistant and doctor, you may meet different members of the healthcare team depending on your needs, such as:

- physiotherapist
- occupational therapist
- dietician
- speech language pathologist
- pharmacist
- social worker
- spiritual care provider

Our Team will work with you and encourage you as you move toward the next stage of your healing – be that home, or another facility.

What You Can Expect on Our Unit

- We will give you a **call-bell**, which we hope you will use. We will try to respond as quickly as we can. Sometimes, the receptionist will find out how to direct your call. Thank you for your patience.
- For your own safety, you are wearing a **UHN I.D.** wristband. Please make sure that it stays on your wrist at all times. We use the wristband to properly identify you for medications, tests, and other procedures.
