

What to Expect After Having Claw Toe or Crossover Toe Surgery

For patients of Dr. Lau

What is claw toe or crossover toe surgery?

The surgery straightens the toe with a pin that holds the toe straight.

Why do I need this surgery?

You have a misshapen toe. We do this surgery to straighten the toe and improve your pain.

What to expect after the surgery

On the day of your surgery:

Your foot is wrapped in a bandage and you wear a surgical shoe (special shoe that protects the foot). <u>Do not</u> change the bandage or take off the surgical shoe, even at night.

Expect your foot to be numb for 12 to 24 hours after the surgery. Every 4 to 6 hours, check that your toes are warm to touch and a normal colour. Keep the ends of the pins dry to prevent infection and help the wound heal.

To manage pain:

- Prop up your foot when you are sitting or lying down by putting pillows under your foot.
 This lessens swelling.
- Take pain medications as you need.

When to call surgeon:

Call Dr. Lau's office at 416 603 6292 right away if:

- your wound is still bleeding the day after surgery
- your foot feels numb or tingling the day after surgery
- your toes change colour (purple, white, or spotted) at any time
- you see yellow fluid coming from the pin
- your toe becomes red and swollen around the pin

On the day after surgery:

You can start walking on the heel of the foot while wearing your surgical shoe. <u>Do not</u> take off the surgical shoe.

Keep propping up your foot and taking pain medications as you need to manage your pain.

2 weeks after surgery:

You have a follow-up appointment in Fracture Clinic at Toronto Western.

- We take new x-rays to check on your recovery.
- We remove the bandage and sutures (stitches).

Continue wearing the surgical shoe and walking on the heel of the foot. Keep the ends of the pin dry.

6 weeks after surgery:

You have a follow-up appointment in Fracture Clinic at Toronto Western.

- We take new x-rays to check on your recovery.
- We remove the pin.

You can start wearing regular shoes (sneakers).

What side effects can I expect?

Your foot may be swollen for 6 to 12 months after surgery. It may feel throbbing, achy and uncomfortable at the end of the day. This is normal and gets better over time.
