### Supportive Communication

Ongoing discussion about how to have honest, sensitive, and empathic conversations with patients and their families is critical for providing effective care. We have begun <u>Project Empathy</u>, a series of educational videos for oncologists and trainees that highlight important moments in oncologist-patient interactions, the challenges that they pose, and effective means to overcome them. We have partnered with oncologists at Princess Margaret (PM), internal and community organizations, and a professional production team. Filming began this month, October 2022.

### Navigation

We are pleased to welcome <u>The Healing Beyond the Body</u> <u>Program (HBB)</u> to Cancer Experience. Led by Megan Wexler (left), HBB offers peer and emotional support to PM patients. HBB will also act as a catalyst for ongoing navigation initiatives. Proactive PSO, our Grand Challenge project co-led by Dr. Madeline Li and Megan,



provides referrals to psychosocial resources like HBB to at-risk patients and is now live in gynecology. CancerSpace, a comprehensive digital navigation platform, is being developed and will provide live support to patients through HBB volunteers.
