ACCESS YOUR HEALTH RECORDS ONLINE

Did you know you can access your personal UHN health records online for free?

What is myUHN Patient Portal?

myUHN Patient Portal is a secure and free website where patients can access their health record information in real time, see appointment details, view patient education resources, share their information with others and print or download results and reports,

Patients can access health and appointment information from University Health Network (UHN) hospitals which include Toronto General, Toronto Western, and Princess Margaret.

myUHN is an example of UHN's primary value in action: the needs of patients come first. From inception, patients and caregivers were involved in planning, co-design and testing. Patients and caregivers told us they want real time access to their health records and we listened!

Currently, there are over 63,000 registered users. The service has a 67% adoption rate, which means that more than half of the patients who learn about the portal decide to sign up.

UHN recently surveyed myUHN users about their experience, and almost 10,000 patients responded. Among the key themes were:

- 94% of patients preferred to look at their results as soon as they were ready even if they could be worrisome.
- 92% of patients preferred to look at the results as soon as they were ready, even if they have to wait until their next appointment to understand what they meant.

myUHN Patient Portal also promotes patient engagement, since 94% of patients reported feeling better prepared for their appointments.

"myUHN Patient Portal has made a radical change in my care at PMH. I understand my condition and play an active role in my care. This is as a result of receiving clinic notes, lab, CT scans and ultrasound reports. It is such an important service. I can't say enough about its importance to me and the quality of my care." --Patient at PM

Educational resources are available on myUHN to help you understand some of your reports. For example, pathology reports are linked to the website My Pathology Report, which can help you understand what you read in your results.

JANUARY 2019: MUSIC MEET-UP

Starting from January 16 through February 20, 2019 from 1-3 PM, Dr. Chana Korenblum (Psychosocial Oncology) and SarahRose Black (Music Therapy) will be facilitating a Music Meet-Up for AYA (Adolescents and Young Adults).

Music Meet-Up is a 6-session group program specifically offered to support young people with a cancer diagnosis. Each weekly session is centred on a specific theme and includes music-based activities and development of practical coping skills. Participants should be well enough and willing to attend all 6 weekly, 2 hour sessions. There is no fee for this program. ***NOTE: No previous music experience is required.
