

## Research Study on Peer Navigation for Patients with Advanced Cancer and their Caregivers

### What is Peer Navigation?

Our Peer Navigation program (“PeerNav”) uses a digital platform to connect patients diagnosed with cancer and their caregivers with a Peer Navigator who has had a similar cancer experience and is trained to guide them through their journey.

We are conducting a study on **the navigation needs of patients with advanced cancer and their caregivers** in order to adapt the PeerNav program to meet their needs.



### Who can participate?

You must be:

- A caregiver (family member or friend) of a person with a stage 4 diagnosis of any type of cancer, and/or cancer that had metastasized, and/or recurred one or more times that is unlikely to be cured,
- Be 18 years or older, and
- Be comfortable using computers and the internet.

### What’s involved?

Participants will be invited to:

- Watch a short video about the PeerNav program,
- Complete a demographic questionnaire,
- Take part in a 2-hour online focus group.
