The Insight to Discovery course run by Dr. B.A. Millar is a pleasure to attend and incredibly useful, both in terms of personal development and building communication skills. As part of the course you are required to complete an evaluation that will generate a four-part “colour profile” along with a highly insightful personalized report of numerous aspects of your personality, your manner of communicating and interactions with other personality types. While the report is confidential, I let my mother read mine and we were both amazed at the accuracy. The report and course allowed me to build self-awareness, as well as awareness of the other personality types around me and the differences in our preferred manner of communicating. In fact, I was able to return to my workplace and immediately translate the communication strategies I had learned into the real world. While the concepts being presented seem relatively simple, they are eye-opening. By applying what you learn in this course, you are starting on a path towards improved interactions with your colleagues, less frustration and ultimately, greater satisfaction in your workplace.

The Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) Young Leaders Programme is a 12-month leadership development programme for emerging cancer control professionals up to 40 years of age. The 2019-20 programme will commence at the World Cancer Leaders' Summit (WCLS) in Astana, Kazakhstan from 15-17 October 2019. In the 12 months following the WCLS, Young Leaders must identify and attend a relevant cancer event, or organise a learning visit which aligns with their interests and expertise and leads to regional impact, or aims to initiate a regional collaboration. The programme will formally conclude at the World Cancer Congress (WCC) in Muscat, Oman from 19-22 October 2020, where Young Leaders attend and share best practices and lessons learnt through a dedicated session. Following completion of the programme, participants join the existing group of alumni Young Leaders, a proactive community of cancer control professionals who engage with and support UICC's work.


