The Lead-Up program is a foundational leadership program for leaders who are new to a leadership role or new to UHN (less than 1 year). The purpose of the program is to enhance leadership capability and capacity in support of UHN's strategic priorities.

The Lead-Up Program was an excellent opportunity for new leaders to learn essential skills required in leadership positions at UHN. There was a good mix of didactic learning on various topics (e.g. coaching, LEAN principles, and crucial conversations) and the opportunity to practice these skills. For example, I found the crucial conversations course very helpful, as it provided a foundation on how to approach conversations with high stakes and high emotions. After learning these concepts, we applied those skills by practicing with professional actors who could give us feedback in a safe environment. During the program, you also complete a DISC and emotional intelligence profile to learn about your own strengths and weaknesses and reflect on how that impacts you and others. Finally, Lead-Up provides the opportunity to meet and learn from other new leaders at UHN. I found this experience invaluable and we were able to work together to solve challenging problems together and support one another. I highly recommend this program for Young Leaders.
