- Clinical, research and/or education involvement in an initiative within the aims of the Global Cancer Program;
- International collaboration or global outreach in oncology;
- Willingness to supervise and mentor trainees;
- Affiliated with the Princess Margaret.

Associate Member

Criteria for Associate Membership is the same as for General Membership, but the applicant does not hold an appointment within Princess Margaret. Activities in research or education within the aims of the Global Cancer Program may occupy a lesser proportion of time. Associate Members must have a collaborator within Princess Margaret.

Clinicians, researchers and educators with an interest in global oncology are welcome to join the Global Community of Practice (CoP). Members of the CoP will be included in the listserv, receive updates about global oncology work happening within Princess Margaret, and may be provided with opportunities for involvement in global oncology initiatives.
