Suppository Use After Spinal Cord Injury



After a spinal cord injury, your bowels may not work as they used to. Your Doctor has prescribed a suppository as part of your bowel routine (going poo). A suppository is a medication that works by tightening the muscles in your bowels to move the stool (poo) out of your body. You can have a bowel movement within an hour of using this medication.

Your Doctor will order a suppository for you called **Dulcolax**. For some people this medication may not work very well. If Dulcolax does not work, your doctor will order the Magic Bullet. **Magic Bullet** works <u>faster</u> than **Dulcolax** because it melts faster. It has the same medication.

Drug coverage

Dulcolax is covered by the Ontario Government drug plans and by Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) program. The NIHB is a plan for eligible First Nations and Inuit peoples.

- Check with your insurance provider to see if it is covered by your insurance plan.
- You will need a doctor's prescription if covered by your insurance plan.
- You can buy this medication at all pharmacies without a prescription.

Magic Bullet is <u>not</u> covered by the Ontario Government drug plans. NIHB will pay for this medication.

- Check with your insurance provider to see if it is covered by your insurance plan.
- You will need a doctor's prescription if covered by your insurance plan.
- This medication must be purchased from specific bladder supplies vendors (see chart below). It is **not** available at pharmacies.
- Buy this medication without a prescription.
