About the Program

The Young Leaders in Cancer Program provides a structured opportunity for professionals specializing in cancer care to come together to explore important topics in leadership, networking and building capacity within our communities to lead. Princess Margaret Cancer Centre is dedicated to fostering the next generation of Leaders in Cancer Care. The program is nomination-based and is open to those:

- In formal leadership roles, and those to in informal leadership roles responsible for leading significant projects
- Who are staff at Princess Margaret
- Are 40 and under

Members do not have to graduate the program after 40 years of age. Members elect to graduate when they feel they are ready.



Networking & Collaboration

Invited to participate in several networking opportunities, Young Leaders connect with senior leaders and each other outside of the pressures of work hours. These include monthly breakfasts hosted by Mary Gospodarowicz and Marnie Escaf to discuss topics in leadership and cancer, invitation to special Insights to Discovery™ sessions to dive deeper into self-awareness and personal communication styles, and social events.

Leadership Competencies

Young Leaders have access to online and classroom-based education through Cancer Campus, Princess Margaret's online learning hub. The Young Leaders education program includes:

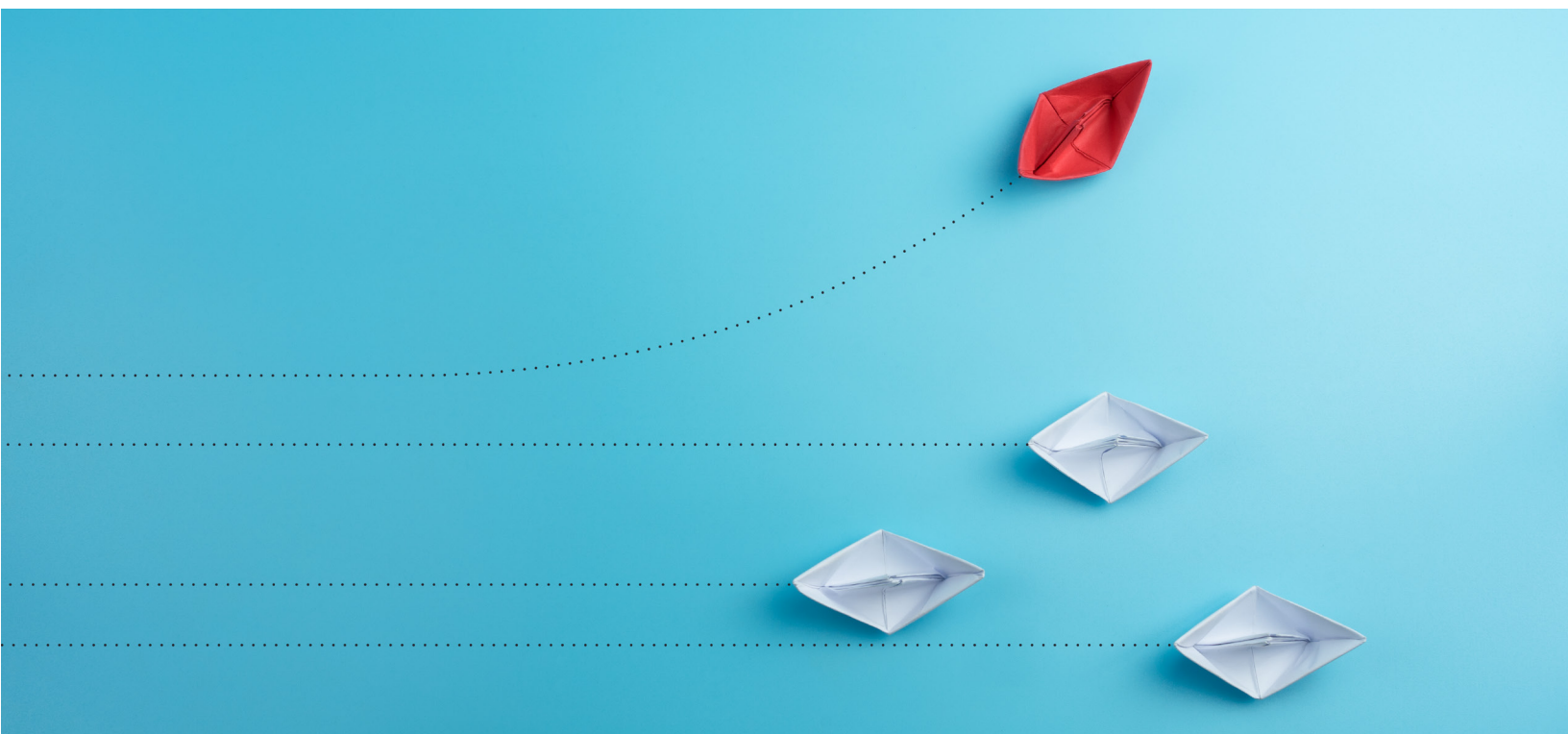
